#### **Enhanced Research Security Emphasis**

A new research security specialist staff position was funded by the CU President's Office to perform a gap analysis and detail recommendations to support our researcher's security needs. UCCS also received a new NSF funded Campus Cybersecurity Planning Grant to assess campus needs to meet future aspirations.



#### Mitigating COVID-19 Impacts on Researchers

Our teams partnered with other campus stakeholders to collect resources, create guidance, and offer support to mitigate the pandemic's impact on researchers, especially women-identified, minority, and caregiving faculty. #### **Growing the Center for Student Research**



The mission of the CSR is to prepare and support undergraduate and graduate student researchers as well as their faculty mentors across disciplines. With 162 student members and 39 faculty affiliates, the CSR provides resources such as mentoring agreements, matching students with faculty, and hosting a variety of professional development workshops and toolkits.

The CSR implements the **Undergraduate Research Academy** and in 2021 funded the largest cohort yet, with 28 student-faculty pairs, using additional support from the CU President's office. Students who take part in the URA have a 35% increase in graduation rates and are almost 2x more likely to pursue graduate studies compared to other UCCS students.
